Topics may include but are not limited to the prevalence and impact of shortages on healthcare systems and on patient outcomes, policy responses, the role of financial incentives, as well as pharmaceutical innovation and supply chain dynamics.

Preliminary versions of papers are accepted, but full papers will be given priority. Presentations will be 45 minutes including Q&A.

Submissions will be reviewed by the scientific organisers, joined by Prof. Dr. Marisa Miraldo (Imperial College, UK), Dr. Dimitrios Kourouklis (Office of Health Economics, UK), and Prof. Dr. Pierre Dubois (Toulouse School of Economics, France).
